Why Participate in Research?

Carefully conducted clinical trials (also known as clinical research) are the fastest and safest way to find treatments that work in people. A clinical trial is a research study with human participants designed to answer specific health questions.

Choosing to participate in a clinical research project is an important personal decision. It is important to understand how clinical research projects are structured and what to expect as a participant before enrolling.
